- Use cereal boxes to cut out Easter eggs, chicks and bunnies
 - Use paper/newspaper/magazines
 - Use grass/twigs/flowers from your garden
 - Cut up material from old clothes/bedding
- If you haven't got glue or sellotape you could mix flour and water to stick paper to make a papier-mâché design
 - Use your child's toys that are small enough to attach to a hat
 - If you haven't got a bonnet, use any hat or headband or make a band out of a strip of card


Build a bird's nest





You will need








 Access to: sticks, grass, leaves, various other natural materials like pine needles, feathers,



Lay some newspaper
 on the ground or a
 table where you want
 to make your nest —
 things are going to
 get messy!





Weave your twigs, grass and moss and your natural materials together, and use some mud to keep it all in place.



Try weaving your nest with two fingers, like a bird's beak! When you've finished, show your nests to each other. Would eggs be snug and cosy? How strong is your nest? How many chocolate eggs you can fit inside?



5 Consider dismantling your nests and leave the materials for real birds to pick up and reuse - try wedging them into shrubs!
